
ABOUT THE COMPANIES

PAINTED FILLY THEATRE connects emerging writers from around the globe with emerging theatre practitioners in Ireland, fostering an ensemble process in which artists of diverse skills and backgrounds are supported in collaboration. It strives for an innovative, "elemental" theatre, distilling text and technique to focus on the body and the story. AUTHOR'S NOTE

"No one is ever as good as their lines."

This play was born while reading James Shapiro's vivid recreation of Shakespeare's life in 1599 and, amongst debts to other biographers, owes much to the author's painstaking research and plausible speculations.

PHIL KINGSTON trained as an actor at Central. His work in the UK includes Live Like Pigs (Royal Court), Anthony & Cleopatra (Red Flag), Hard Times, Grimm Tales (Stephen Joseph), Macbeth (Tabard), Bleat (Finborough) and Look Back in Anger (City Lit). He also appeared in the feature Judge Dredd, the short Manhunter and the TV shows The Bill, London't Burning and Cone Zone. His first play Hungry Ghosts was staged at the Tabard Theatre. He subsequently wrote for The Bill. Phil moved to Ireland in 2006 and appeared in Catastrophe (International Bar), 100 Minutes 2006 and 2007 (Filmbase, Project), Mandragola (Turning Worm), Biography of Bernie Ward (Players), The Maids and Phaedra's Love (Loose Canon). TV and film work in Dublin includes the short The Melon Hunter (Graham Cantwell), George Gently and The Tudors. He wrote and performed Dr. Dillon and Ms. Georgia (Teacher's Club) for the Dublin Fringe 2006, and two of his short plays featured in 100 Minutes 2007 and 2008. In October he will appear in Bedrock's Wedding Day at the Cro-Magnons.

NICK JOHNSON (director) is an artistic director and executive producer for Painted Filly Theatre. Recent directing credits include his translation of *Masses and Man* (Samuel Beckett Theatre) and *Masse Mensch* (Volksbühne, Berlin). He created the format for the annual 100 Minutes production, and was artistic director of 100 Minutes 2008 (Project). In 2007 he directed his collection of Beckett adaptations, *Disjecta* (Beckett Theatre), and the world premiere of *Biography of Bernie Ward* (Players Theatre). An actor for 20 years, he holds a theatre degree from Northwestern University and is currently completing a PhD on Beckett at TCD, where he is a full-time lecturer. He was a 2004 DAAD Fellow researching Brecht in Berlin, and he received the 2005 George J. Mitchell Scholarship and the 2007 Samuel Beckett Studentship in support of his work in Dublin.

JENNIFER KILLELEA (producer) is a co-founder of Painted Filly Theatre. She holds a certificate of Arts Management and Practice from the University of Ulster, an M.Phil in Irish Theatre and Film from TCD, and a BA in English and Media Studies from Fordham University, New York. For Painted Filly Theatre, Jennifer has produced the world premieres of *Jeremiah* (International Bar) and *Biography of Bernie Ward* (Players Theatre), as well as the Irish premiere of *Noise* (Dublin Fringe Festival 2006) and 100 Minutes 2008 (Project). She was a director, producer, and author for both 100 Minutes 2006 (Filmbase) and 100 Minutes 2007 (Project). Jennifer recently directed a public reading of *Judgement Has No Shoes* by Daniel Kelley.

KATHERINE GRAHAM (designer) has previously worked with Painted Filly as lighting designer for 100 Minutes 2008 (Project). Recent lighting designs include Art (Mephisto, Town Hall Studio, Galway); Pantomime (Arambe, DFF '08); Masse Mensch (P14, Volksbühne, Berlin); The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari (Samuel Beckett Theatre); Through a Film Darkly (Arambe, Project); Disjecta (Samuel Beckett Theatre); Find Me, Threepenny Opera and Low in the Dark (Samuel Beckett Theatre) and Dr. Faustus (DU Players). Other design work includes costume for My Mother Said I Never Should (best costume nominee, ISDA 2007); costume for Two Room (Focus); stage and costume for Black Comedy and stage, lighting, and costume for Tongues. She directed and designed Under Milk Wood and Slowset (DU Players). She holds a degree in Drama Studies and Modern Irish from TCD.

FIONA LINNANE (composer) holds a BMus from University College Cork and an MA in music technology from the University of Limerick, and now studies composition with Kevin O'Connell at the RIAM. She is director of the "Ensemble for the Undead Composer" (COMA Limerick) and sings with a capella jazz trio "The Swingettes."
